When we remove from this place, we engage as soon as possible to unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word.



A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

"I must preach the kingdom of God to other cities also." Luke 4:43 (KJV)

Jesus tells us how important it is to preach the kingdom of God. Going abroad to preach is more relevant today than ever before. Humanity is in need of salvation by way of the Savior, Jesus Christ.

Christ Jesus is the bearer of Heaven's great news. The news from God's kingdom states that heaven is opened to everyone but reserved eternally for those who believe in the Son Jesus Christ as Lord. While dead in the flesh, He preached in Hell, saved a few more souls, and put death on hold to prove his power over sin, death and the grave. Not many people want to believe



Alice H. Parker
Live-Cook / Inventor
(December 17, 1895 — 1920) age 24-25

When you turn up your thermostat you have Alice H. Parker to thank. Born in Morristown, New Jersey where she grew up, she was inspired to create a new home heating system due to the harsh winters and because she felt fireplaces were not effective enough or safe to keep homes warm.

At a time when it was rare for African American women to receive a college education, Alice graduated from Howard University with honors. She is known for inventing the natural gas-powered furnace. She wanted a more efficient and safer way to heat the home than with wood or coal. In December of 1919 she received a patent for her heating invention. It is not known what she studied at Howard University, but it is said she had no experience in this area. Her design was based on the idea that natural gas was safer, more flexible and a more efficient source of fuel than others being used at the time.

While her exact specifications for the gas furnace she invented was never adopted, the concept did resemble modern gas furnace models. Her concept allowed you to customize temperatures in different rooms using a series of burners, ducts and a heat exchange. Her gas-powered furnace however did inspire more inventions in the heating industry like the thermostat and forced air furnace that we use today.

It is also important to know that Parker received her patent before the Civil Rights and Women's Rights movements. She was able to conquer adversity and make an impact on generations at a time when African American woman faced significant adversity if they wanted to make valuable contributions to society. Thank you, Alice H. Parker, for paving the way.


