## *A message from our Pastor*

*Praise the LORD, Saints!*

“Master, carest thou not that we perish?” *Mark 4:38 KJV*

It seems that everyday the media is covering stories of death. Death seems to be what news breaks thrive on. The more violent the death, the more intriguingly our attention is captured.

It's saddening and sickening but far worse, if it's someone you know or are related to who meets a tragic end. There is no rhyme nor reason to whom the death bell rings. It may come by the hands of other humans preying on one another or by nature itself. However it comes, it's devastating to those who survive it and probably more intense to those seeing death approaching speedily and can't get out of its way.

The disciples saw it coming. They were at the brink of death on that boat at sea. Some were trained fishermen and familiar with the ebbs and flows of aquatics, but this storm was a different type. The storm was in concert with nature. The lightening wrote its signature across the dark skies. The winds swirled majestically and whipped up the sea in torrential response. The waters rose in a swelling tempest to the rhythm of the storm. It struck fear in their hearts because they had never seen nature orchestrate such a potential doomsday melody.

That particular moment had all the trappings of a death toll all around it but there lay Jesus, fast asleep. Not one time did the fierce rocking of the boat disturb His sleep. Neither did the nearby thunderous sounds startle him. He did not lift his head one time to see what was going on. The masses of incoming water on the boat did not faze him either. He only shifted his body a few times to reposition himself to remain comfortable in his sleep.

## *Pastor's message continued*

Yes. That's what Jesus did during the storm. We, however, toss and turn all night in the storms of life. Every noise, bump or movement makes our hearts race faster. We stretch ourselves to unknown limits of worry and stress from fear of the violent storm. We, like the disciples, often wonder why Jesus would sleep during crucial moments of our fearful storms while we seem to perish.

One thing we must be certain of. If Jesus is in the boat, what's to worry about? Knowing the Master is aboard gives us confidence that he cares and is aware of the circumstances. I believe that Jesus slept because he was tired. His sleeping gave the disciples an opportunity to master their faith. Faith is to be mastered not exhausted. You master faith by using it not losing it. Jesus awoke and told them they had little faith.

When faith is little, it often reaches its boundaries of exhaustion. When faith is mastered, it continues on and on because the storms will keep coming and coming but in different clothing. Therefore, Saints, master your faith, so that you can calm the storms of life no matter how they come dressed to kill.



# Our summer internship program is SUCH a cool summer job.

Our interns get **paid** well to learn how to work and communicate with others, attain general work skills, finance fundamentals, resume-building, networking and more!

Interns will spend one day a week at the Detroit Zoo and are required to visit (as a team, bussed) multiple beautiful state parks for both work site (invasive species removal, trail camera monitoring) and paid recreational opportunities like canoeing and high ropes courses and camping. They will work once per week in Detroit City Parks to complete a capstone project installing intentional meadows for birds and other wildlife, and the other days here at the Nature Center, Monday through Thursday, 9am-5pm. The internship runs June 28-August 19.



▶ This program will take place at the Belle Isle Nature Center from June 28 to August 19 and pays \$11.61 per hour.

▶ Requirements:

- Must reside in Detroit (if in college, you must have a permanent address in Detroit).
- Must be between the ages of 16-19. All interns that are 16-17 years old must be able to obtain a valid work permit before the start of the program.

# FEMA COVID-19

## Funeral Assistance

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April. In the meantime, people who have COVID-19 funeral expenses are encouraged to keep and gather documentation.

### Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

### How to Apply

Applications are being accepting applications. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include:

- An official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- Funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.

### DO YOU KNOW? BLACK HISTORY FACTS

**Lucien Victor Alexis, Sr.**  
Educator  
(July 8, 1887— 1981)

Born in New Orleans, La to Louis Victor and Alice Saucier Alexis. He was attended the local school where he would excel academically. At the age of 20 he would work as a railway mail clerk. Saving his earnings for seven years before having enough to attend Harvard for four years. The prestigious university did accept him but asked him to first attend Phillips Exeter Academy, a prestigious preparatory high school, in New Hampshire for one year before starting at Harvard. This when he fell in love with foreign languages and the science.

Now with only having enough for three years of tuition, he would finish 'cum laude' graduating one year early in 1917. He was nicknamed "The Negro Einstein". After graduating he entered Officers Training School in Des Moines, Iowa and was commissioned as a 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant and assigned to Infantry.

Upon returning to New Orleans, he took began his profession of teaching in 1921. In 1923 he was appointed assistant principal at Willow Elementary, and 1923 he became principal of McDonogh #35, the only public high school opened to educate colored students. For 30 years she would hold this position leaving an indelible mark on the institution still being echoed by his former students today.

He would find time to teach advanced classes in Latin. He was known to be strict but fair when disciplining his students. He had a strict dress code and if violated you would find the offenders marching up and down the second floor of the school building. He was so well respected that his students would not be approached by unsavory characters once it was known they were his students.
