- Leader:** So Hatach went forth to Mordecai unto the street of the city, which *was* before the king's gate.

- ... All:** For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, *then* shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place; but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed: and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for *such* a time as this?

His holiness requires a sacred space, filled with a theological atmosphere where a faith-driven spirit within a baptized believer understands something about God's grace.

Grace prefers a special place and a special time to be especially effective. Be special.





City of Detroit Flood Information & Available Resources

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ALL :

Start the process of cleaning your home, removing debris and sanitizing your basement. And, if you have insurance, you should file a claim with your insurance company.

IF you still have standing water in your basement that you believe is an immediate health hazard, DWSD will send a city or contractor crew to your location. Please make sure to indicate this on the online form, on the Improve Detroit app (choose "Water in Basement") or when you call 313-267-8000.

IF you have bulk items from the flood damage, you can put them out immediately. We have 15 city crews on the streets picking up those items as fast as we can. You will not be ticketed for leaving storm-related debris out at your curb.

Flood cleaning supplies are available at two locations on July 1 and July 2 at 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. at the Patton Recreation Center at 2301 Woodmere and the Samaritan Center at 5555 Conner.

IF you are a senior or a person with a disability and need help clearing debris from your basement, we will have volunteers to assist you. Please indicate if you are a senior and/or a person with a disability on the online form, on the Improve Detroit app (choose "Water in Basement") or when you call DWSD at 313-267-8000.

City of Detroit Flood Information & Available Resources

GENERAL INFORMATION TO FILE YOUR CLAIM :

Start the process of filing a claim

The City of Detroit will make every effort to assist residents including helping with possible reimbursement through the federal government. If your property has flood damage, you may be able to get reimbursement. You can file a claim locally with DWSD and we will be able to file with FEMA if a Presidential declaration of disaster is issued.

Submit the claim using this online form, use the Improve Detroit app (choose "Water in Basement") or call 313-267-8000 if you need assistance completing the form.

It is very important to document your losses with photos of the flood damage and receipts related to cleaning out your basement and repairs. If you have insurance, you should file a claim with your insurance company immediately.

DWSD damage claim information

Under state law, you have 45 days to file a claim with DWSD, which in this case is August 10, 2021. However, this was a historic rain-storm and backups in most cases are not likely due to a local sewer system defect. We will use your claim information to jump start your FEMA process if Presidential disaster declaration is granted.

- There is no cost for the vaccine.
- Pfizer vaccines offered for those **12-17 years old**
- **Walk-Ins** welcomed at all City sites.
- Transportation and wheelchair-accessible accommodations are available if needed.
- Anyone needing a ride to get a COVID-19 vaccine shot will be able to get a free trip from the ride-sharing companies Lyft and Uber
- For adults 18+ **Any form of ID** is acceptable. Under 17 years of age will not need proof of identification.
- Parent or guardian must accompany children ages 12-17 to their appointment and must sign a consent form.

- Vaccines offered at pop-up events, pharmacies, and other areas in Detroit.

Other Services Available:

- **At home covid vaccine appointments** call 313 230 0505 to make an appointment
- **Good neighbor program** where you can receive \$50 per person you take to get their vaccine per dose. Call 313 230 0505 you must register as a good neighbor before making the first dose appointment for your friends and neighbors. Everything can be done at the same time on the same call.

FEMA COVID-19

Funeral Assistance

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April. In the meantime, people who have COVID-19 funeral expenses are encouraged to keep and gather documentation.

Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

How to Apply

Applications are being accepting applications. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include:

- An official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- Funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.

DO YOU KNOW? BLACK HISTORY FACTS

**Little Known Black History Facts
You May Not Have Learned in School
Various History Makers**

- *Phillis Wheatley was the first African American to publish a book of poetry, *Poems on Various Subjects, Religious and Moral*, in 1773. Born in Gambia and sold to the Wheatley family in Boston when she was 7 years old, Wheatley was emancipated shortly after her book was released.*
- *After graduating from Oberlin College in 1850 with a literary degree, Lucy Stanton became the first Black woman in America to earn a four-year college degree.*
- *In 1940, Hattie McDaniel became the first Black person to win an Oscar for her supporting role in *Gone With the Wind*. 24 years later, Sidney Poitier became the first Black man to win an Oscar for his leading role in *Lilies of the Field*.*
- *In 1920, Fritz Pollard and Bobby Marshall became the first Black athletes to play in the NFL. Pollard was also the league's first Black coach.*
- *Dubbed "Hip-Hop's First Godmother" by Billboard, singer and music producer Sylvia Robinson produced the first-ever commercially successful rap record: "Rapper's Delight" by The Sugarhill Gang. And along with her husband, she co-owned the first hip-hop label, Sugar Hill Records.*
- *In 2012, at the London Olympics, Gabby Douglas became the first Black gymnast to win the Individual All-Around title.*
