

- The **VASES** symbolizes the resurrection of Jesus and the live **FLOWERS** in the vases stand for life.
- The **OPEN BIBLE** symbolizes the Word of God (*The Truth*).





Third COVID-19 Shots Now Available at all Detroit Vaccination Sites

- Immunocompromised Detroiters can get third vaccine shots at sites throughout city
- Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are available for third shots
- Booster shots expected to be available for all fully vaccinated Detroiters beginning Sept. 20

The City of Detroit is expanding its efforts to provide more locations for immunocompromised Detroiters to get their third vaccine dose. TCF recently began offering the third shot and has given it to almost 2,000 Detroiters. All vaccination sites in Detroit now offer the third shot to immunocompromised individuals by either appointment or walk-ins.

Any Detroiters who is immunocompromised and received their second dose of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 28 days prior is eligible for the third shot.

The City will also begin providing booster shots for all fully vaccinated Detroiters on September 20 six months following completion of their second dose of either Pfizer or Moderna.

All eligible Detroiters can make an appointment to get vaccinated in their own home, including the third dose. To make an appointment for any of our vaccination sites, call 313-230-0505 or log onto Detroitmi.gov/Health to schedule an appointment online. Walk-ins are also available.

- There is no cost for the vaccine.
- Pfizer vaccines offered for those **12-17 years old**
- **Walk-Ins** welcomed at all City sites.
 - Transportation and wheelchair-accessible accommodations are available if needed.
- Anyone needing a ride to get a COVID-19 vaccine shot will be able to get a free trip from the ride-sharing companies Lyft and Uber
- For adults 18+ **Any form of ID** is acceptable. Under 17 years of age will not need proof of identification.
- Parent or guardian must accompany children ages 12-17 to their appointment and must sign a consent form.

- Vaccines offered at pop-up events, pharmacies, and other areas in Detroit.

DO YOU KNOW? BLACK HISTORY FACTS

BUFFALO SOLDIERS 1866—1950'S Interesting Facts

- *Established in 1866 at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, they were originally members of the Army's 10th Cavalry Regiment.*
- *The name was given to the 10th Cavalry by the Cheyenne and other plains Native America tribes who fought in the Indian Wars. It was later applied to all black regiments formed in 1866. It was taken as a sign of respect to the Native Americans and the reverence they held for the buffalo. Later the buffalo was adopted as part of their regimental crest.*
- *Buffalo Soldiers could only serve west of the Mississippi because many whites didn't want to see armed black soldiers in or near their communities.*
- *For 20 years the Buffalo Soldiers would serve by protecting settlers, mail wagons trains and stagecoaches on supply routes, battling cattle rustlers and thieves and other outlaws.*
- *Buffalo Soldiers had the lowest desertion and court martial rates of their time. At least 18 soldiers were awarded the Medal of Honor for their service during the Indian Campaigns.*
- *Buffalo Soldier Henry O. Flipper was born into slavery and was the first black man to attend West Point. He graduated in 1877 and later became of the first black Buffalo Soldier officers.*
- *Mark Matthews, the nation's oldest living buffalo soldier, died in 2005 at age 111 in Washington, D.C.*
