RESPONSIVE READING:

Leviticus 16:1-10

- Leader:** And the LORD spake unto Moses after the death of the two sons of Aaron, when they offered before the LORD, and died;
- People:** And the LORD said unto Moses, Speak unto Aaron thy brother, that he come not at all times into the holy *place* within the vail before the mercy seat, which *is* upon the ark; that he die not: for I will appear in the cloud upon the mercy seat.
- Leader:** Thus shall Aaron come into the holy *place*: with a young bullock for a sin offering, and a ram for a burnt offering.
- People:** He shall put on the holy linen coat, and he shall have the linen breeches upon his flesh, and shall be girded with a linen girdle, and with the linen mitre shall he be attired: these *are* holy garments; therefore shall he wash his flesh in water, and so put them on.
- Leader:** And he shall take of the congregation of the children of Israel two kids of the goats for a sin offering, and one ram for a burnt offering.
- People:** And Aaron shall offer his bullock of the sin offering, which *is* for himself, and make an atonement for himself, and for his house.
- Leader:** And he shall take the two goats, and present them before the LORD *at* the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.
- People:** And Aaron shall cast lots upon the two goats; one lot for the LORD, and the other lot for the scapegoat.
- Leader:** And Aaron shall bring the goat upon which the LORD'S lot fell, and offer him *for* a sin offering.
- ... All:** But the goat, on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat, shall be presented alive before the LORD, to make an atonement with him, *and* to let him go for a scapegoat into the wilderness.





Third COVID-19 Shots Now Available at all Detroit Vaccination Sites

- Immunocompromised Detroiters can get third vaccine shots at sites throughout city
- Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are available for third shots
- Booster shots expected to be available for all fully vaccinated Detroiters beginning Sept. 20

The City of Detroit is expanding its efforts to provide more locations for immunocompromised Detroiters to get their third vaccine dose. TCF recently began offering the third shot and has given it to almost 2,000 Detroiters. All vaccination sites in Detroit now offer the third shot to immunocompromised individuals by either appointment or walk-ins.

Any Detroiters who is immunocompromised and received their second dose of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 28 days prior is eligible for the third shot.

The City will also begin providing booster shots for all fully vaccinated Detroiters on September 20 six months following completion of their second dose of either Pfizer or Moderna.

All eligible Detroiters can make an appointment to get vaccinated in their own home, including the third dose. To make an appointment for any of our vaccination sites, call 313-230-0505 or log onto Detroitmi.gov/Health to schedule an appointment online. Walk-ins are also available.

- There is no cost for the vaccine.
- Pfizer vaccines offered for those **12-17 years old**
- **Walk-Ins** welcomed at all City sites.
 - Transportation and wheelchair-accessible accommodations are available if needed.
- Anyone needing a ride to get a COVID-19 vaccine shot will be able to get a free trip from the ride-sharing companies Lyft and Uber
- For adults 18+ **Any form of ID** is acceptable. Under 17 years of age will not need proof of identification.
- Parent or guardian must accompany children ages 12-17 to their appointment and must sign a consent form.

- Vaccines offered at pop-up events, pharmacies, and other areas in Detroit.

DO YOU KNOW? BLACK HISTORY FACTS

Hiram R. Revels
September 27, 1827—January 16, 1901
United States Senator

He was born free in Fayetteville, North Carolina during a time of widespread slavery in the south. Both he and his brother apprenticed as barbers. After his brother's death he inherited barbershop his brother owned where he would continue to work before beginning his seminary studies in the north. In 1845 he was ordained a minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, working as an itinerant preacher.

In 1870, would feel the seat previously held by the president of the Confederacy, Jefferson Davis, making him the first African American to become a member of the of the U.S. Senate. Revels would now represent the state of Mississippi. He is the first of eleven to be elected or appointed to the Senate as of 2021. During his one year of service in the senate he advocated for integrated schools and equal opportunities for Black workers.

Serving only one year in the senate he would resign to accept the position of president of Alcorn Agricultural and Mechanical College, a historically black school. He would also serve as an instructor in philosophy. Working at the college would allow him to work directly in the intellectual enrichment of African Americans, a cause his fought for while in the Senate.
