RESPONSIVE READING:

Numbers 14:1-10

Leader: And all the congregation lifted up their voice, and cried; and the people wept that night.

People: And all the children of Israel murmured against Moses and against Aaron: and the whole congregation said unto them, Would God that we had died in the land of Egypt! or would God we had died in this wilderness!

Leader: And wherefore hath the LORD brought us unto this land, to fall by the sword, that our wives and our children should be a prey? were it not better for us to return into Egypt?

People: And they said one to another, Let us make a captain, and let us return into Egypt.

Leader: Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces before all the assembly of the congregation of the children of Israel.

People: And Joshua the son of Nun, and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, *which were* of them that searched the land, rent their clothes:

Leader: And they spake unto all the company of the children of Israel, saying, The land, which we passed through to search it, *is* an exceeding good land.

People: If the LORD delight in us, then he will bring us into this land, and give it us; a land which floweth with milk and honey.

Leader: Only rebel not ye against the LORD, neither fear ye the people of the land; for they *are* bread for us: their defence is departed from them, and the LORD *is* with us: fear them not.

All: But all the congregation bade stone them with stones. And the glory of the LORD appeared in the tabernacle of the congregation before all the children of Israel.



A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

“Love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, that thou mayest live.” (*Deuteronomy 30:6*)

God wants the best for us. He wants us to enjoy living while here on earth. This scripture instructs us on what it takes to live a great life.

Society probably thinks that certain things are needed to have a great life. It is suggested that if you lack certain things, then life is more challenging and difficult to enjoy. When we commit our love and souls to God, His word obligates him to give us abundant life, which means, He can supply all of our needs. Only God, and He alone, is the sustainer of our lives. According to God, what we do with this life is entirely up to us, but we must be held accountable.

I firmly believe that you can do all things through Christ Jesus because he is the one who strengthens you. You do not have to be weakened and subjected to stereotypes or feel boxed in by corruptive forces in high places. God is above all things that are against you. If you, therefore, commit the love of your heart and soul to Him, you will live better than you have ever imagined despite the haters.

The key is imagining. Imagine yourself getting the desires of your heart. See yourself achieving those goals that define your success. Break away from the imprisonments that have labeled you as a person. You are only shiftless, lazy, or incapable of thinking productively if you think you are. Your destiny is not shackled by what others say or think about you, but your boundaries are unlimited according to where the love of your heart and soul are committed. The love of your heart and soul for God is what the key to your imagination opens up.

Pastor's message continued

There are so many things that can be done to show God how much you love him, but we fall shy of showing it by the decisions we make. Some of the things that block our blessings and the opportunities to fully live start right here with us. For instance, our church participation fluctuates. Our commitment is more to the love of self, family and friends. We think our jobs, lifestyles and earned time-off deserves more of our time than service for God.

"No time for prayer meeting." "Sunday school is too early and boring." "I can't stand on my feet that long and usher." "I can't sing good enough for the choir." "Sunday services are too long." My favorite one to hear is, "That preacher screams too much." All of those are excuses that Jesus spoke in the scriptures about our spiritual dispositions.

"Pray without ceasing." "Study to show thyself approved." "I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of the Lord." "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord and lift your voices." "The kingdom of God, or Heaven, is eternal." Jesus cried from the cross "with a loud voice." I paraphrased some of those sayings, but read them for yourself.

As you can see, however, for every excuse used to not be committed to God, the Holy Scripture invalidates that excuse. If you want to live abundantly according to God, love him with all your heart and soul by dedicating yourself to being different than others who choose otherwise. Surely you can live a long life without doing any of those things, but what does it profit a man, or woman, to gain the whole world and lose his soul? I choose life. What's your choice?





DO YOU KNOW? BLACK HISTORY FACTS

Claudette Colvin

Civil Rights Activist

(September 5, 1939 Age: 82)

Born in Montgomery Alabama, at the age of 16, nine months before Rose Parks, she was the first to refuse to give up her seat on the bus to a white passenger.

She attended school, studied hard earning mostly A's and she aspired to become president one day. On March 2, 1955, riding the bus home from school, she was told to give her seat to a white passenger. She refused saying she paid her fair, and it was her constitutional right to sit where she was sitting. She felt the weight of Sojourner Truth on one side and Harriet Tubman on the other side pushing her down in her seat.

She was arrested on several charges, including violating the city's segregation laws. She would spend several hours in jail afraid and terrified until her minister paid her bail, and she was released to go home. She and her family would stay up all night concerned about possible retaliation.

The NAACP had considered using her case to challenge segregation laws but chose not to because of her age and because she became pregnant and was not married, they felt it would attract too much negative attention.

She did oppose the segregation law and declared herself not guilty in court. The court ruled against her, and she was placed on probation. Unable to escaped public opinion, she was labeled as a troublemaker, and she dropped out of college. The once quiet student now had a reputation making it impossible for her to find a job.

Colvin became one of the four plaintiffs in the Browder v. Gayle case. The Attorneys Fred Gray and Charles D. Langford filed on their behalf got a decision in the 1956 case that ruled Montgomery's segregated bus system was unconstitutional.
